

Tenure-track Assistant Professor in Statistics

The Department of Mathematical Sciences at DePaul University invites applications for a tenure track position in statistics at the Assistant Professor level beginning September 2015, contingent upon available budgetary resources.

DePaul is one of the nation's ten largest private universities, and the only one whose faculty priority is teaching. In addition to offering a broad array of mathematics and statistics courses at the undergraduate level, the department offers graduate programs leading to Masters Degrees in Applied Statistics and Applied Mathematics with concentrations in Actuarial Science or in Statistics.

The department seeks candidates actively engaged in research and strongly committed to teaching. The candidate is expected to have a Ph.D. degree in statistics or a closely related field. Candidates with background and interest in applied statistics or biostatistics are especially encouraged to apply.

Applications must be submitted electronically to mathjobs.org and should include a curriculum vita, transcripts, a letter describing the applicant's teaching and research interests, and three letters of recommendation, at least one of which addresses the applicant's teaching effectiveness. Applicants are also encouraged to supply additional information such as formal teaching evaluation summaries.
